

English-Practice.at is a website with interactive exercises and tasks for English language learners at the **intermediate (B1)** and **upper-intermediate (B2)** level. You can access the whole website free of charge. In order to do the exercises, you must have an account. You can **self-register** from the login box. After confirming your email address, you will be logged in and are ready to go .

Note: You must log in at least once every three months, otherwise your account will be deleted. (This ensures that only users who really want to practice can do so.)

Dashboard

Once you log in you have access to your **Dashboard**, which you can be customized to meet your personal needs. You can see a list of all your enrolled courses.

Clicking on **All courses** takes you to a list of all courses which you can enrol in.




African Americans Your progress ?

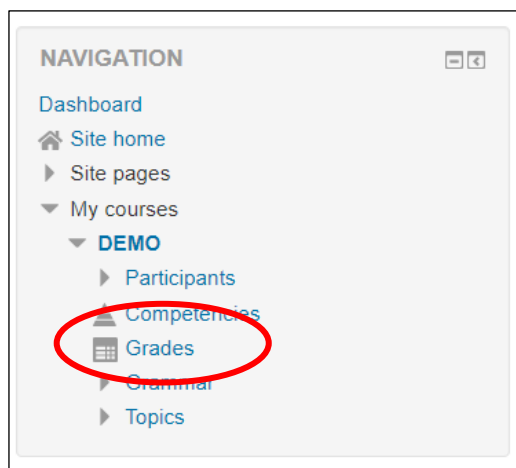

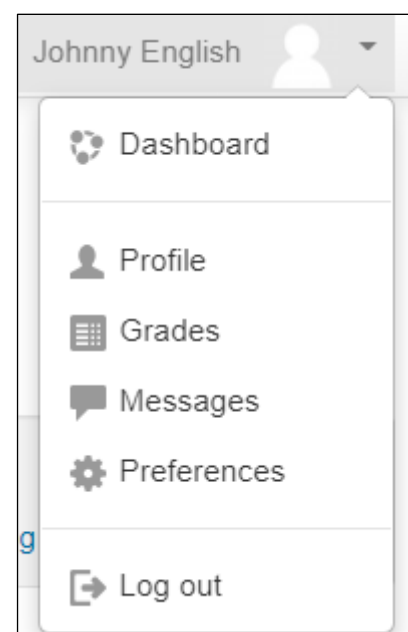


By clicking on **Grades** in the **Navigation block** you get a list of all the results in the course.

User Menu

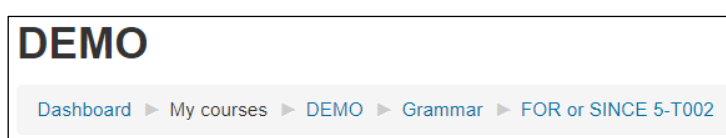
The User Menu appears on all pages in the top right corner under your name.
